hode Island will be expanding its medical marijuana program this coming year to include six new medical dispensaries. In this CLE, participants will learn the legal framework and history of medical marijuana in Rhode Island. We will discuss some unique considerations for marijuana businesses, such as special lease, general business contract, and employment contract provisions. We will review some of the challenges with continued federal illegality, particularly in intellectual property law, federal litigation, and banking, and creative strategies to deal with these issues. Finally, we will review the adult use legal framework in Massachusetts and pull out lessons or potential forecasts for any future adult use in Rhode Island.

The presenters will cover the basic procedures in planning the small-to-medium estate. You will learn the pertinent questions you need to ask to establish estate planning objectives with your client and receive a sample checklist of those questions. They will review sample forms to use in the documents, including forms related to Credit Shelter Trusts, QTIP Trusts, and trusts for the benefit of minor children. They will also discuss peripheral documents, such as living trusts and various kinds of powers of attorney.

In addition, the presenters will discuss the administration of a decedent's estate. They will begin with the initial interview with the family following death, move through the various stages of the probate process, and discuss estate and income tax issues of a decedent.

Ethical issues inherent in the planning and administration of estates will also be highlighted. The presenters will cover problems in representing spouses, fiduciaries, and beneficiaries.

This program is designed for both new attorneys in their transition from law school to law practice and attorneys who are not involved in estate planning and administration on a regular basis.
